EVENT REPORT (2018 -2019)

ORIENTATION PROGRAMME

1. FACULTY ORIENTATION AND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

The orientation programme for faculty was held on 8th June, 2018 under the patronage of a Resource person from CCK College. The programme aimed to provide prospects to faculty members to enrich their teaching skills and to inculcate learning values in students, guiding and monitoring their progress.

The discussed areas were of great benefit to the participants as the topics matched with the current working domain. The Resource person appreciated the efforts taken by Rev. Mother Leema Rosario, Secretary of the College, in organizing the kind of events which helped in the holistic growth of the faculty.
